Call for new auditors OECI A&D Programme

Performing a peer review visit as an OECI auditor is a **learning experience** in your own professional life, in the fight against cancer in your own Centre, as well as a crucial part of ensuring quality improvement in an applicant Cancer Centre.

During a peer review visit you will have the opportunity to examine all aspects of the Cancer Centre, both the organisation at the management level and at the clinical and laboratory level for all disciplines, e.g. for nurses, physicians, researchers, pathologists, management etc.

When and where?

Date: The training will take place on the **25**th – **27**th of **October 2021** in Inveruno, Italy, at the beautiful location of the Villa Verganti-Veronesi near Milan.

It is organised by the OECI A&D Group, the OECI Liaison Office and Kerteza, a company specialised in auditor training. At the end of the training, the participants will receive a certificate of participation.

Who are we looking for?

There is a special need for **Directors** who have the ability to act as chair of a team to strengthen our pool, as well as **nurses** and **senior researchers** (for instance Group Leaders or Principal Investigators in Trials). Directors must hold a position on the Board (or equivalent) of an OECI Member Centre.

The maximum number of training participants is 16 people. A selection will be done on the basis of background, experiences and current positions of the applicants.

To qualify, an auditor needs to be employed by a cancer centre that is a member of OECI, and actively involved in cancer care, research, education, quality control or management. It is important that the management of your cancer centre commits to having the auditor conduct an audit in working hours on behalf of OECI, on average twice a year.

The training includes

- Introduction in quality management and auditing,
- Introduction of the OECI quality standards, procedures and tools,
- Roles and responsibilities of auditors and chair of an audit team, as well as the OECI coordinator,
- Theoretical background and practical exercises on preparation of an audit, teamwork as an audit team.
- Role plays in performing an OECI audit.
